Prof. Pease is an authority on 19th- and 20th-century American literature and literary theory and the founder/director of the Futures of American Studies Institute at Dartmouth. In his teaching and research he has transformed and shaped American Studies for the 21st century. Some of his numerous publications are: *Cultures of U.S. Imperialism* (with Amy Kaplan, Duke University Press, 1992), *National Identities and Postnational Narratives* (Duke University Press, 1994), *New American Exceptionalism* (University of Minnesota Press, 2009 — Nominated for the James Russell Lowell Prize at MLA), *Theodor Seuss Geisel* (Oxford University Press, 2010), *Re-Framing the Transnational Turn in American Studies* (co-edited with Winfried Fluck and John Carlos Rowe, *Re-Mapping the Transnational: A Dartmouth Series in American Studies*, 2011), and *American Studies as Transnational Practice: Turning toward the Transpacific* (co-edited with Yuan Shu, Dartmouth College Press, 2015).

Donald E. Pease is Professor of English and Comparative Literature, The Ted and Helen Geisel Third Century Professor in the Humanities, and Chair of the Master of Arts in Liberal Studies Program at Dartmouth College, NH, USA.
