

CALL FOR PAPERS


This year, the United States commemorates the 250th anniversary of the signing of the Declaration of Independence. We are particularly interested in contributions that explore the tensions between democratic ideals and political realities, past and present.

Guiding questions include:

- Which elements of the democratic vision articulated in 1776 continue to shape the United States today?
- Where do we see contradictions between promise and practice?
- How can historical narratives be brought into dialogue with contemporary developments?
- Which role may artistic expression play in the negotiation of democratic ideals?

Possible topics include, but are not limited to:

- the Declaration of Independence as a historical document and an object of memory culture as well as its cultural relevance and symbolic power
- slavery, racial exclusion, and the Dol's legacy
- women's rights then and now: inclusion, exclusion, and reinterpretation
- critiques of the Dol across time
- the Dol in different academic disciplines
- representations in film, literature, and video games
- contemporary perspectives on the Dol
